A couple of other good sources are Breitbart and the Judicial Watch. There is also a newspaper publication called The Epoch Times that is very good. The following are some takeaways from articles found on the Heritage Foundation's website.

The first is entitled "1776 Commission can Have a Second Life Outside of Federal Government" dated February 8, 2021. This is actually a follow up to a segment of my message in the February Newsletter. The three takeaways of this article are as follows:

It is a shame that the president does not want a conversation about the principles of equality and liberty that animate our national life.

American values really are unifying: no matter who we are, we all can appeal to the principle of equality under the law when someone violates our civil rights.

There is no better source of American unity than the principles we share as codified in the Constitution. Let's rededicate ourselves to understanding them.

The American people can bring it back, and we don't need government approval to do so.

Another article from HF is entitled "Why Action Civics is More Action than Civics: K - 12 Students Aren't Ready to be Activists" dated February 8, 2021. Here are three takeaways.

Action civics encourages students to participate in protests and demonstrations more than study history and our founding ideals.

Once students have participated in the political event of their choice, they are more likely to change their beliefs or cement their existing ones to match.

Students are being pressured into political movements without giving their ideals proper thought and analysis.

Another article from HF is entitled "The Agenda of Black Lives Matter is Far Different from the Slogan". It is dated July 3, 2020. Here are the takeaways.

Visit the Black Lives Matter website, and the first frame you get is a large crowd with fists raised and the slogan "Now We Transform."

This agenda isn't what most people signed up for when they bought their Spanx or registered for Airbnb.

The goals of the Black Lives Matter organization go far beyond what most people think.

One other item regarding BLM and Cancel Culture is on the Judicial Watch website and is dated February 16, 2021. The headline of the article is as follows:

Judicial Watch Sues on Behalf of a High School Coach Fired for Objecting to BLM / Critical Race Theory Curriculum for Daughter's 7th Grade History Class. In short, Coach Flynn was fired for exercising his constitutional right to object as a citizen and father to an extremist and racially inflammatory school curriculum in his child's history class.
